## WHAT TO EXPECT FROM US

- A yearly stipend of \$320, plus free tickets to all events hosted by The Ethics Centre including limited tickets to the Festival of Dangerous Ideas
- One half-day, in-person meeting in late April at The Lab, our venue in Sydney's CBD
- Four two-hour meetings held throughout the year:
  - Involves feedback, suggestions and discussion on current Centre youth projects and new ideas and opportunities for the future
  - Organised and facilitated by The Ethics Centre's Youth Coordinator
- Support throughout the year, networking with peers, connecting with compatible organisations, and applicable real-world experience (It looks great on a resume!)
- Opportunities to significantly impact the development of youth projects, events and content from The Ethics Centre

## WHAT WE EXPECT FROM YOU

- Participation - in meetings and with one another
- A sense of openness and honesty about your experiences as a young person
- Access to online Zoom meetings and communication with the Council and coordinator outside of meetings
- At least a one-year commitment to the Council. In 2024, we are implementing a two-year rolling membership model to encourage a mix of new and older members, so we will encourage you to stay on for a second year if possible
